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
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### Introduction

# About Ipswich

Ipswich is the oldest continuously inhabited Anglo-Saxon town in England but boasts a "new" Waterfront, a new university and a cultural offer that attracts visitors from all over the world.









It is one of the fastest growing urban centres in the East of England region and the fifth fastest growing economy in the UK. It is also in the top 10 cities and towns when it comes to opportunities for start-up companies.

A third of a million people live within 15 miles of the town centre and enjoy thriving commercial and educational sectors, cultural festivals, theatres, museums and excellent sports facilities.

The area is home to BT's Global Research and Development HQ, Innovation Martlesham, a cluster of more than 100 high tech SMEs and Ipswich Waterfront Innovation Centre at the University of Suffolk. There is a significant and growing cluster of highly skilled finance, insurance and legal firms, including Willis Towers Watson and AXA, which sit alongside a growing number of fintech businesses.

The Port of Felixstowe is the UK's largest container port on the premier EU/Asia route and the Port of Ipswich is the UK's largest exporter of grain. Both are investing in future expansion and support a nationally significant hub of ports and logistics related businesses.

Ipswich has four Enterprise Zone sites in and around the town, the completed £21m tidal barrier and government approval for a new wet dock crossing

spanning the Waterfront. This is set to unlock more enterprise and innovation, boost jobs and future housing growth for the town.

These global assets, combined with its proximity to London and development opportunities linked to our Enterprise Zone sites make the area a development location with huge potential.

Further development of the high quality and growing arts, heritage and cultural scene, which together with access to high quality leisure activities, coastline and unspoilt countryside firmly reinforces lpswich as an excellent place to live, work and enjoy.

On the doorstep of artist John Constable's countryside and the desirable Suffolk coastline, around an hour from London means you can have the best of both worlds in just a short commute.

# **Ipswich Connected**

A key public and private transport hub, boasting excellent links within Britain and the rest of the world.

#### Road

Ipswich occupies a strategically significant position at the crossroads of the A12 and the A14 trunk roads. The A12 south of Ipswich connects the town and east Suffolk, including the Port of Felixstowe to London, the South East and beyond. The A14 is also a key part of the Strategic Road Network and is an internationally important route linking the Port of Felixstowe to the Midlands, the Northern Powerhouse, Wales and Ireland.

The A12 north of Ipswich is the strategic link to the national road network for Lowestoft and the whole of east Suffolk.

Greater London can be reached by car in an hour and 15 minutes. Cambridge can be reached in an hour.

#### Rail

Ipswich is an important rail interchange on the London to Norwich main line. Planned improvements to the Great Eastern Mainline will bring Ipswich within an hour of The City and 30 minutes from Norwich. Ipswich Railway Station also connects the mainline to:

- the east-west line to Cambridge and Peterborough and then on to the East Coast Mainline;
- the East Suffolk Line to Lowestoft; and
- the Felixstowe line

#### Sea

A short distance from the Port of Felixstowe, the biggest and busiest container port in the UK and one of the largest in Europe, connecting to the A14 part of the Trans-European Transport Network. Stena Line operates a route to Harwich (32 miles from lpswich) from the Hook of Holland.

#### Air

London Stansted is 50 miles from Ipswich. National Express coaches offer travel from Stansted to Ipswich via connections from Heathrow and Gatwick airports. Norwich Airport and London Southend is also easily reached from Ipswich.

#### Getting Around

Ipswich is well served by buses to the town centre as well as services linking to many Suffolk towns and villages, a Park & Ride service and a free shuttle bus the loops the town centre at lunchtime. Urbo dockless bike sharing scheme was launched in 2018, providing 500 app operated bikes in Ipswich for short distance commutes, business journeys and exploring the town and parks.

#### Digital Connectivity

Broadband connectivity is a key component of the infrastructure offer that a city can make to businesses, entrepreneurs and residents. The development of optical fibre has considerably increased broadband speeds, 90% of Ipswich premises have access to 'ultrafast' (>100Mbps) speeds.

### Town Centre

Ipswich has evolved into a regional centre of excellence with many stylish places to eat and drink, great shopping with a good representation of high street stores and smaller independent shops and excellent leisure and cultural facilities.

An extensive events and entertainments programme, along with the Regent and New Wolsey theatres and popular museums, also helps to promote the town centre. Ipswich is home to eight Arts Council-funded National Portfolio Organisations, supported by the Borough Council that will continue to drive culture and tourism, putting Ipswich firmly on the map as a visitor destination.

There has been a lot happening in the town centre, with funding for a new-look Cornhill main square, a revitalised Buttermarket Centre and Sailmakers shopping centre. More retailers are opening and expanding and independent shops are also making a name for themselves.

New arrivals in the town include, Pandora, Jack Wills, Tiger, White Stuff, Office, KIKO Milano, Swarovski, Tessuti, Prezzo, Wagamama's, Coast to Coast, Cosy Club and Byron Burgers, complementing well-established stores such as Marks & Spencer, Debenhams, River Island. TK Maxx and Monsoon.

Ipswich is proud of its strong core of successful independent retailers. The streets in central Ipswich have changed

little since medieval and Saxon times and these smaller streets and historic buildings lend themselves well to the independent, boutique style of retailer. The Saints and Blackfriars are the best-known areas, offering small, quirky shops, fabulous restaurants, cafés and bars and sits half way between the town centre and the Waterfront.

A new style of town centre with mixed leisure, housing and retail is seen as the way forward as urban centres across the country look for new ways to survive and thrive in an era of internet shopping and changing public demand.





Ipswich is truly a town of contrasts. Its vibrant shopping district and variety of entertainment facilities are complemented by over 800 acres of parkland and open space, and its central conservation area boasts more than 600 listed buildings, including 12 medieval churches.

#### Serviced Office Accommodation

Ipswich has multiple providers of services office accommodation for established firms. The largest providers are Masterlord Office Village; Basepoint, Suffolk Enterprise Centre (operated by NWES) and IPCity (operated by IBC). There are a number of smaller business centres located in the town centre and on the outskirts of Ipswich.



# Enterprise Zones

These zones, established by the New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership, offer considerable business benefits to businesses, including business rate discounts of up to £275,000 over five years, simplified planning and access to superfast broadband.

These areas also have Assisted Area status so businesses can receive a higher rate of funding from the Growing Business Fund:

< 50 employees – 30% funding on grants up to £500K

**50 -250 employees** – 20% funding on grants up to <u>£500K</u>

> 50 employees – 10% funding on grants up to £500K

There is also an Annual Investment Allowance of £200K per year that enables a business to deduct the value of qualifying items from profits before tax.

The EZs in the Ipswich area are four of 10 sites which form New Anglia LEP's 'Space to Innovate' Enterprise Zones. The zones offer incentives to encourage businesses to relocate, grow and create more jobs in the local economy. In the 25-year lifetime of the zones, 18,500 new jobs will be created, including 5,000 by 2021.

- ✓ Providence House, a new HQ for Birketts, a £12m new build occupied in summer 2018

**Waterfront Island** - two hectares of port land separating the Wet Dock from the tidal river with part of the Island given Enterprise Zone designation this is being master-planned by ABP. The Waterfront is one of the most desirable locations in Ipswich, with restaurants and cafes, a thriving marina as well as



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being home to the university, Jerwood DanceHouse and a growing number of tech companies.


Swich Park - an Enterprise Park at Sproughton. A 44-hectacre site, owned by the Borough Council, in Babergh District, one of the largest strategic development sites in Suffolk. With unrivalled access to the A14 at J54 make it an ideal location for a wide range of businesses. Ipswich Borough Council will be building the infrastructure in 2018, creating a high quality, landscaped setting for bespoke buildings from 20,000sq ft.


